We had a fantastic day browsing the artisan market stalls whilst listening to live music, and many people took up the opportunity to roller skate in the middle of the Square. The event was proudly funded by the NSW Government as part of the Open Streets program. It aimed to inject vibrancy into our streets which clearly came to life with basketball workshops, a canopied outdoor dining space, interactive artwork, table tennis and a kid's craft activity!

Council will be making a submission to the State Government regarding the Homebush Transport Oriented Development masterplan, and will include the local community feedback received during the consultation phase. Whilst Council shares the NSW Government's vision of the precinct, it will require

State and Federal funding to support the delivery of this precinct and ensure required infrastructure is provided adequately for a growing population.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to submit their feedback. This proposal will have a significant impact on the Homebush Precinct long into the future and should be shaped by the needs of those who call it home.

Council's draft Community Safety
Strategy is on public exhibition until 30
August 2024. The Strategy supports a
collaborative approach to ensure actions
address antisocial behaviour and aid
in crime prevention. The Strategy has
been endorsed by Auburn and Burwood
Police Area Commands and supports the
Community's vision of a safe, inclusive and





- Replace old lights with LED light bulbs
- Switch off your appliances, don't just leave them on 'standby'
