Dear Strathfield Residents,

We had a special delegation lead by Mayor of Gapyeong County, Teawon Seo visit Strathfield from South Korea on Monday 20 May 2024. Council's Sister City guests visited Mason Park wetlands, the Enfield Intermodal, Library, Driving Range and more, learning all about the work Council does throughout our local government area. Since 2011, Strathfield and Gapyeong have enjoyed a close and supportive relationship with each other and have had extensive cooperation between organisations including exchanging knowledge in public administration, education, culture and tourism.

In other news, Council's Community
Grants program opened on 1 June 2024
and will close on 31 July 2024. This program
has previously supported a number of
wonderful initiatives for the betterment
of our community including healthy
living seminars for seniors, equipment for
accessible learning, church repairs, and
cultural festivals. Head over to our website

new round of applications this year.

Council's staff have been busy in the last month working through several projects. You may have noticed we have new street trees! Street trees provide habitat for animals, combat heat and improve the overall appearance of an area. 127 trees have been planted across the LGA including Smallwood Avenue, Hillcrest Street, Dickson Street and Wentworth Street.

Our roads and footpaths have also been given some attention with over 22,308m2 of roads repaired and 3,290m2 of footpaths. We're excited to provide these safer travel ways for residents.

Finally, we haven't forgotten our littlest residents, with repairs underway at several playgrounds (see the back page for more



information). These works are part of a wider asset renewal project which you can learn about by scanning the QR code.



Lastly, Council is installing continuous yellow line markings at intersections to enforce 'No Stopping' restrictions. As per Australian Road Rule 170, a driver must not stop within 10m of an unsignalised intersection or 20m of a signalised intersection unless a parking sign says they can. Supporting road safety is an important function of Council and we thank residents for working with us on this initiative.





SUSTAINABILITY

Say No to Single Use Plastics

Plastic bags are used for an average of 12 minutes, but a single plastic bag takes up to 1,000 years to break down and litter our waterways and environment. A super simple and easy solution to this problem is by practising the first stage of the 5 R Principle – REFUSE, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose, Recycle.

By refusing unnecessary items and saying no to single use plastics, you can stop waste at the source and make a significant impact. Opt for reusable alternatives like your favourite tote bag, your favourite coloured mug/keep cup, or tupperware next time you visit your local cafe, restaurant, or

Refuse unnecessary items by saying no to single use plastics and items

REDUCE

Reduce the amount of waste you create by reducing the amount of items you buy.

REUSE

Reuse items where possible

REPURPOSE

RECYCLE

Recycle items properly to prevent useful esources from goin

Weed Alert: Cotoneaster

Cotoneaster is mildly toxic to humans. The fruit is poisonous and can cause gastroenteritis, but a large quantity would need to be eaten to have this effect. The berries also contain another unidentified toxin which causes vomiting and diarrhea in dogs. It forms dense thickets under trees shading our local native species. Street Tree Planting Project

Council is planting 127 new street trees across the Strathfield local government area in June with a further 24 trees to come! Most species being planted reflect the existing species found in our streets, however, Council aims to increase diversity by introducing new species such as Tree Waratah (Alloxylon flammeum) and Red Ash (Alphitonia excelsa).

Our Capital Works team has been very busy working to complete Council's Road and Footpath upgrade project. Over 22,308m2 of roads and 3,209m2 of footpaths were repaired throughout the month of May.

- Bark Huts Reserve has had it's flying foxes and see-saw repaired, and the futsal court has been pressure cleaned.
- Strathfield Park flying foxes are all in the process of being re-tensioned.
- Austin Park has had running repairs and also has been re-painted and re-oiled.
- Surface repairs to the rubber soft fall have been carried out at Cooke Park, Edwards Park, Melville Reserve, Ismay Reserve, Mason Park, Strathfield Park and Bressington Park.
