COUNCIL INFORMATION

Strathfield Council is a medium sized Council located in Sydney's Inner West.

The Strathfield Local Government Area (LGA) has a total area of approximately 14.1 square kilometres. Strathfield Council is located in Sydney's Inner West about 10.5 kilometres from the city centre and half way between Parramatta and the city.

The Strathfield Local Government Area includes the suburbs of:

Strathfield (postcode 2135) Strathfield South (2136) Homebush (2140) Homebush West (2140) part of Belfield (2191) part of Greenacre (2190)

COUNCIL MEMBERS

Local government is comprised of two sections, political and administration. The political side is made up of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Councillors who attend Council meetings on a monthly basis and vote on plans and decisions that affect the community and its long-term future.

The Mayor is elected every two years by the majority of Councillors.

The administration staff, under the guidance of the CEO, manage the day to day operations. There are many departments in Council that provide a range of services for the community.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Voting at Local Government elections is compulsory in NSW. To vote in elections you need to be on the Electoral Roll. The Electoral Roll is prepared and maintained by the Australian Electoral Commission. New residents should complete the electoral enrolment form and forward it to the Electoral Office. Enrolment forms can be obtained from any Australia Post Office.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

Council Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of the month (excluding January), at 6.30pm, in the Council Chambers, 65 Homebush Road, Strathfield. Council Meetings are open to the public, except for discussion of legal, staff or other confidential matters.

Members of the public may attend Council and Committee Meetings and may speak on matters, such as those in general business on the agenda of the meeting. Members of the public can also view Council meetings live online.

Business papers including the agenda and reports, are available on Council's website on the Thursday prior to the Council meeting. Minutes of the Council Meetings are placed on Council's website within five working days of the meeting.

CLEAN UP COLLECTION

Council's On Call Clean Up service allows each residential property three clean up collections per year of up to two cubic metres for the removal of bulky household items. Council clean up bookings are collected on Mondays.

Before booking your clean up, consider contacting The Bower Reuse and Repair Centre for free collection and recycling of furniture and household items in good condition.

WASTE

There are three different coloured bins used in the Strathfield LGA.

The red lid bin is used for general household garbage. This bin is collected on a weekly basis.

The yellow lid bin is used for recycling. This bin is collected on a fortnightly basis.

The green lid bin is used for garden vegetation. This bin is collected on a fortnightly basis.

LITTER AND ILLEGAL DUMPING

Leaving rubbish on the footpath, nature strip, in a park, laneway, street or next to a bin is illegal. On-thespot fines for littering or dumping apply.

Litter and illegal dumping cause many problems, such as:

- Pollution of waterways
- Blockage of drains
- Health risks
- Attraction of vermin
- Waste of resources
- Cleaning and disposal cost for all community

BACKYARD SWIMMING POOLS

All pools in NSW must be registered in the NSW Swimming Pool Register. It is the pool owner's responsibility to register their pool.

All new swimming pools require approval. If you want to build a swimming pool you must ensure that the pool is surrounded by a fence to restrict access to children.

DEVELOPMENT APPLICATIONS

Before you can make changes to a building, you may need to a lodge a Development Application.

A Development Application (DA) is a formal request for consent to carry out development. This type of development approval is the most common way of obtaining development consent in NSW.

From 1 July 2020, all planning applications, including Development Applications and Complying Development Certificates for Strathfield Council will need to be electronically lodged online via the NSW Government Planning Portal. Paper applications will no longer be accepted.

RATES


Council rates are calculated according to the value of land in the area. The value of land in the Strathfield Local Government Area is determined every three years by the NSW Valuer General. Council sets a rate in the dollar in its annual Operational Plan, which is then multiplied by your land valuation. This is then paid by owners of the properties.

There are many factors that are taken into consideration when deciding on land value including recent sale prices, zoning and access to public facilities. This means that rates charged for properties in the Strathfield Local Government Area will be different to rates charged by other councils.

BAY TO BAY CYCLE AND WALKWAY

Inter-Library Loans


